

Paella Trivia by ICESUSA.org

Object of the game:

Learn about Spain while eating paella and testing your knowledge of paella trivia. In just one meal, explore Spanish history, geography and cuisine – hopefully with the help of an exchange student from Spain!

How to play Paella Trivia:

First things first: Start making your paella! Get that rice bubbling...

Then, while the rice is simmering, cut out the paella trivia cards.

Give all players 15 minutes to Google paella and learn everything they can.

Set the table, placing your delicious paella in the middle. *(Don't forget to take pictures!)*

Give each player a plate of paella and a set of A, B, C answer cards.

Put the paella trivia cards in a pile, face down on the table next to the youngest player.

The youngest player starts by taking a paella trivia card and reading the question.

All players answer simultaneously by placing an answer card (A, B or C) on the table.

Every player with a correct answer gets a point. Keep track on a score board.

Youngest player passes the stack of cards to the right.

The next player reads a question for everyone to answer simultaneously...

The player with the most points wins – *and doesn't have to wash the dishes!*
